2019 Guarini School of Graduate and Advanced Studies Survey Overall Results

Executive Summary

Methods

Nine hundred and forty-eight graduate students (including Ph.D. and Master's) from the Guarini School of Graduate and Advanced Studies and Thayer were invited to participate via email. The survey was administered electronically by the Office of Institutional Research. A pre-survey notice was sent to each student from Kerry Landers, Assistant Dean of Graduate Student Affairs. The survey invitation and four email reminders were sent from the Office of Institutional Research. The overall response rate was 50% (471/948). The response rate for Ph.D. students was 58% (355/612) and for Master's it was 35% (116/336). A gift certificate to the Pine restaurant for \$50.00 was provided as incentive.

There were no statistically significant differences between survey respondents and non-respondents due to race/ethnicity ($\chi 2 = 1.98$, p > 0.05), or student type ($\chi 2 = 1.52$, p > 0.05). Statistical significant differences were found between majors ($\chi 2 = 87.95$, p < 0.0001), with responses highest among students who majored in Ecology, Evolution, Ecosystems & Society (95%), and lowest among students who majored in Health Care Delivery Science (19%). Demographics

Respondents largely self-identified as White (53%), followed by International (29%) and Minority (16%). Fifty percent of the respondents were female and 50% were male. Respondents were largely continuing graduate students (72%) and 28% were first-year graduate students.

Overall Key Findings

Academic experience, resources, and services

- The majority of the respondents (77%) were satisfied or very satisfied with their graduate education.
- Fifty-eight percent of the respondents rated their academic experience at Dartmouth as very good or excellent and 39% rated their student life experience at Dartmouth as very good or excellent.
- Sixty percent of more of the respondents rated the following support and services provided by Dartmouth as very good or excellent: programs and resources of the teaching center or program (DCAL; 60%), laboratory, clinical, studio, or other physical facilities (63%), and Information technology resources (65%). Thirty-eight percent of the respondents rated the psychological counseling services as poor or fair.

Ratings of program climate

Seventy percent or more of the respondents rated their department or program climate being friendly (81%), welcoming (75%), encouraging (74%), respectful (74%), and supportive (70%). However, less than half rated their department or program climate being diverse (34%), positive for non-Native English speakers (47%), positive for people of spiritual/religious backgrounds (47%), and positive for persons with disabilities (47%).

Eighty-five percent of the respondents reported their own relationship and interactions with faculty are positive. Three quarters or more of the respondent also reported their peers valued their research/scholarship (81%), they had the resources they needed to succeed (77%), and financial support for students in their program was distributed fairly (75%).

Ratings of contact with advisors

- Fifty-nine percent of the respondents interacted with faculty on a weekly basis or more often; 18% interacted with faculty twice a month.
- Seventy percent of the respondents had the right amount of contact with their advisors, 17% mentioned they did not have enough contact or did not receive the guidance they needed.

Ratings of faculty, courses, and other aspects of academics

- Over seventy of the respondents agreed that their primary advisor discussed research with them on a regular basis (75%), gave them constructive feedback on their work (76%), and shared her/his considerable experience and/or training (76%).
- While major obstacles to academic success were limited, more than one in five reported the following: cost of housing (31%), self-confidence (25%), physical and/or mental health issues (24%), academic or social isolation (22%), and the current job market (21%).
- Slightly less than half (49%) of the respondents rated their development as a scholar as very good or excellent. Forty-four percent of the respondents rated their development as a teacher as poor or fair.
- Over sixty percent of the respondents rated course content depth and breadth outside their area as very good or excellent (63% ~ 66%). Course content depth and breadth within their area were both rated lower (51% ~ 56%).
- Eighty-six percent of the respondents agreed or strongly agreed that the conduct of qualifying exams was fair. Most of the respondents also agreed or strongly agreed that the qualifying exams were useful in consolidating their knowledge (84%) and the exam topics were relevant to their training (86%).

Ratings of research opportunities

Early research opportunities (e.g., laboratory rotations, research assistantships, faculty-advised research projects or papers) were rated as somewhat effective or very effective by 76% of the respondents. More than two-thirds of the respondents also rated the following as somewhat effective or very effective: A departmental/program orientation to help you understand the process of completing your graduate degree (73%); a written set of expectations about academic requirements and expected progress in your program (69%); and organized exposure to faculty and their current research interests (68%).

Ratings of teaching assistantships

More than half of the respondents (56%) had one or more teaching assistantships at Dartmouth recently, and 36% of those who had teaching assistantships noted that these teaching appointments increased their interest in teaching in the future.

Scholarly activities and productivity

In the past year, 46% of the respondents attended and 39% presented a paper/poster at a professional conference. Thirty-four percent of the respondents submitted scholarly work for publication and 27% published scholarly work. Twenty-two percent of the respondents wrote or assisted in writing a grant proposal.

Future plans

- When entering their program, 54% of the respondents envisioned themselves working in academia and 33% in business/industry/self-employment after graduation. In contrast, at the time of the survey, 36% envisioned themselves working in academia and 45% in business/industry/self-employment after graduation. About 10% of the respondents currently plan on a career in the government/non-profit sector.
- Sixty-three percent of the respondents stated that their programs were preparing them adequately for their current career goals.

Looking back

- Eighty-three percent of the respondents indicated that they would probably or definitely choose to pursue a PhD or Master's if they could start all over again; 78% would choose the same field of study; and 60% would choose to come to Dartmouth.
- Sixty percent of the respondents would probably or definitely recommend Dartmouth to someone considering their field of study.

There are many differences between majors in respondent ratings (see Appendix 2). Significant between-group differences are highlighted in color.

There are some differences in results due to race/ethnicity/citizenship (See Appendix 2). Significant between-group differences are highlighted in color.

There are many differences in results due to student type (continuing vs. new graduate students; see Appendix 2). Significant between-group differences are highlighted in color.
